Additionally, Dr. Flagg was the Director of Health Policy at the California Medical Association. Dr. Flagg's research interests include state policy making and health care politics with a focus on Medicaid expansion. Dr. Flagg is a lecturer in the UC Berkeley, School of Public Health and San Francisco State University.

Stephen M. Shortell, Ph.D., M.P.H, MBA is the Blue Cross of California Distinguished Professor of Health Policy and Management Emeritus, Dean Emeritus, and Professor of the Graduate School at the School of Public Health and Haas School of Business at University of California-Berkeley where he is the Founding Director of the Center for Healthcare Organizational and Innovation Research (CHOIR) and Co-Director of the Center for Lean Engagement and Research (CLEAR) in healthcare. He was recently elected to the Modern Healthcare Hall of Fame.



Mayor Darrell Steinberg is the current Mayor of the City of Sacramento California. He is the Founder of the Steinberg Institute and former President Pro Tempore of the CA State Senate. He is a powerful and effective advocate for mental health care policy in California. He has a long history of championing policy issues affecting brain health, and has gained the respect and trust of providers, decision-makers, business leaders and advocacy organizations across the state and nation.



Richard Scheffler is a Professor in the Graduate Schools of Public Health and the Goldman School of Public Policy. He is the Director of the Nicholas C. Petris Center on Health Care Markets and Consumer Welfare. In 2019, he was appointed by Governor Newsom to the Healthy California Commission. Dr. Scheffler has received the Berkeley Citation, one of the highest honors awarded by UC Berkeley.
