Leslie Wind was born in Washington DC in 1951 to parents immersed in the music industry. She briefly joined the Hollywood music production scene after high school, but eventually moved in an academic direction, obtaining an MSW from UCLA and a PhD from the USC School of Social Work

Leslie was an educator, clinician, researcher, advocate, community organizer, author and mentor. Initially a

clinical social worker in private practice, she also served in clinical director roles with a mental health agency and a residential treatment facility. She then entered the field of academia as an assistant professor at Boston College. In 2008, Leslie joined USC as a clinical associate professor and director of the Orange County Academic Center, where she was later honored with NASW's Lifetime Achievement Award.

Most recently, Leslie was USC's Senior Associate Dean and Chair of the MSW program. In this role, she demonstrated how a person can simultaneously be a great problem solver, stick-your-neck-out risk-taker, and disciplined organizational leader while also showing tremendous compassion for people.

For all of Leslie's professional accomplishments, family was always her first priority. She and Jim were happily married for over 41 years, and together they built a life as personal partners, professional colleagues, and caring parents and grandparents. Leslie was also an "adopted mom" and mentor to countless students and colleagues — a world traveler and lover of Hawaii and big dogs — and a woman who always put others first. Leslie always did what she loved, and regularly reminded us that life is short. In fact, her Amazon Prime password was

"lovethismoment!"

Finally, Leslie battled a sinister cancer for more than 9 years ... 8 years longer than doctors had predicted. Her grace, positive attitude, and unflinching courage, however, were a continuing source of inspiration. Leslie was an amazing wife, mother, grandmother, leader, colleague, clinician, mentor and friend. She touched so many lives. She left so many legacies. And she will be forever missed.
