- Ability to work independently, creatively and productively in a high stress environment with minimal supervision.
- Flexibility and comfort with ambiguity are required

- Provide brief, targeted training, education, resiliency strategies and interventions to improve operator mission capabilities, mitigate occupational exposures that impact their psychological health to promote a speedy recovery and reintegration.
- Develop, plan, and initiate programs in the areas of performance enhancement, resilience, and organizational effectiveness to support all behavioral health aspects of operator readiness.
- Provide technical expertise and consultation regarding research in mental health, mental performance, and organizational effectiveness to unit leadership and human performance team.
- Provide traumatic stress response and psychological first aid services as needed.
- Liaison to community resources and programs for unit members.
- In collaboration with the MTF Mental Health Clinic, provide referrals and individual patient care for unit members.
- Administer and interpret psychosocial assessment(s) (appropriate to patient type and reason for referral) to assist in treatment plan.
- Formulate treatment plans to include the use of evidence-based psychotherapeutic interventions.
- Maintain accurate and current Mental Health notes and patient records.
- Actively collaborate with case management and health care teams in identification of outcome indicators, data collection and analysis.
- Respond to unit members in crisis and assist with referrals and coordination of higher levels of care on an as needed basis.
- Participate in the medical profile and medical board process for unit members.
